




- A company focused on producing carbonnegative hydrogen fuel from organic feedstocks, such as agricultural waste and compost.



Definitions


Direct Effects: Immediate changes from an activity or project, like jobs created by a new business and spending on construction.

Indirect Effects: "Business-to-business" impacts as supporting industries increase output, such as suppliers benefiting from the business need for raw materials.

Induced Effects: Changes in household spending due to increased income from direct and indirect jobs, with workers spending more at local businesses.

Economic Impact


IMPLAN Model

- 200–250 jobs | Avg. salary: \$80K
- \$16–20M in direct wages
- \$40–50M total economic impact
- 350–400 total jobs created (direct + ripple effect)
